

Task Force Updates

Discovery and Access - This group continues to explore system possibilities in Ex Libris's Alma (ILS) and Primo (discovery layer) for the discovery and access of retention commitments, along with library needs, and what current gaps could be filled. Recently welcoming 9 new members, their final report will be issued later this year.

Matching Algorithms - The group continues to meet bi-weekly and has begun comparisons of small sets of test records using the ReCAP and Gold Rush algorithms, along with an AI model from the California Digital Library. Ex Libris also expressed interest in running these test records through their algorithms for comparison.

Resource Sharing - Continues to meet with vendors on exploring the possibilities of surfacing shared print in resource sharing systems and understanding CDL workflows.



Rosemont-Partnership Program Update

Exploring Strategic Consolidation

Investigate value and viability of merging:

- Already collaborating through joint meetings, events, and committees
- Reduce duplication of effort while maximizing effectiveness and efficiency
- Collectively articulate pros and cons
- Create decision-making criteria for what success looks like
- Use that criteria to evaluate two scenarios

• Status quo (separate organizations that collaborate in specific areas)

• Merge to create a consolidated organization

• Make recommendations regarding those alternatives

Deliverables

- Define desired goals
 - Should be independent of any recommended org structure
 - E.g., reduce workload, increase engagement, etc.
- Define assessment criteria
- Criteria must address potential harmony / misalignment in:
 - Vision & Mission
 - Governance Model
 - Business & Financial Model
 - Membership & Participation Model

- Themes discussed:
 - o best employ effective services for shared print retention?
 - o achieve clarity of voice & impact within library community?
 - o support the needed infrastructure?
 - align scope, goals, and a clear value proposition?
 - ensure sustainability of operations?
 - ensure parity of advocacy for the two formats (journals & books)?
- Gathered input from respective Operations Committee members via survey using assessment rubric.
